Several days before the webinar, you will receive a link to pre-recorded presentations by the speakers as background information for the panel discussions.



Speakers, Korea



Dr. In-Jin Jang is a Professor and the Director of Department of Clinical Pharmacology and Therapeutics, and Clinical Trials Center of Seoul National University Hospital (SNUH). He is a clinical pharmacologist who is responsible for research and education in the field of pharmacology and clinical pharmacology, especially pharmacogenomics and PK/PD. He is in charge of therapeutic drug monitoring consultation, execution of phase 1 clinical trials and general is a Lead Clinical Project Manager working with global clinical trials within Research and Development imangement of Clinical Trials Center at SNUH.



Line Kongstad is a Lead Clinical Project Manager working with global clinical trials within Research and Development in the Danish company LEO Pharma A/S. Line is included in the planning and conduct of global clinical trials in accordance with the applicable regulations and standards. Running trials globally is an interesting challenge due to the cultural differences for health authorities, health care professionals and patients. Line has recently completed three phase III clinical trials where a new treatment of atopic dermatitis was investigated. The trials were run globally across regions and South Korea participated in of the trials. The collected data will be valuable to provide new medicines to patients around the world.

Speakers, Brazil



Elizabeth de Carvalhaes is the Executive President at Interfarma. Interfarma is a pharmaceutical research industry association that represents pharmaceutical laboratories promoting the interaction and tightening of relationships with the healthcare authorities on clinical research, regulatory environment, disseminating the innovation concepts as an economic development vector, in the public and private spheres.



Maria Helena Dominguez Vall-Lamora is an Associate Professor of the Faculty of Health and Medical Sciences at University of Copenhagen and Frederiksberg Hospital. Helena's research tasks are essentially translational, ranging from mechanistic experimental human studies, investigator-initiated clinical trials and public health interventions. The latest is currently the ground of an ongoing Brazilian-Danish project that Helena coordinates, for reaching heart failure patients with telemedicine with an aim to hopefully provide advice from cardiology experts to support to Primary Care to manage challenged patients, such as those from slum quarters in Rio de Janeiro.

Speakers, Israel



Nathan Keller is the Vice-Chairman of the IRB Committee and Director of the Department of Clinical Microbiology at Sheba Medical Center. Sheba Medical Center is the largest hospital in the Middle East and conducts 70% of clinical trials in Israel. Professor Keller is also Past President of the Israeli society of Infectious Diseases. Professor Keller's work has been acknowledged by awards throughout the years for various studies he has conducted and his numerous original scientific articles are published in well-known medical and research journals.



Lotmit Bourvine is the Clinical Medical Regulatory Director at Novo Nordisk Israel with responsibility for the clinical trials of Novo Nordisk in Israel. Lotmit has years of experience in conducting clinical trials from several leading pharma companies. She has been conducting the Israeli trials of Novo Nordisk for the past two years. Novo Nordisk has conducted numerous trials at Israeli hospitals for many years and is deeply involved in R&D in Israel.
